Dear members and friends,

I hope and pray that you have had a peaceful and restful Christmas season and are ready for all that the New Year will bring.

When I commenced writing my newsletter on the first Friday in 2024, I selected the photo to the right, of the sun setting over the ocean on the east coast of Argentina (taken almost exactly 6 years ago), as my image which speaks to our 2024 theme for Mothers Union in our diocese.

Early on this Epiphany morning Ian and I parked our motor home overlooking Flinders Bay in Augusta, from where we broadcast morning prayer for today on our parish Facebook page.



As we parked the image at the top of the page, of the sun rising over the water, presented itself to me in what I would describe as a 'God moment' - the sun shining brightly in our diocese as a new day dawned.

I share with you once again my thoughts on how we should begin to approach our theme this year:

In late October I attended the opening of the inaugural art exhibition at Frederick Irwin Anglican School. In the program for the event, the Head of Practical and Creative Arts, Mr Rod Silvey, asked that we not walk past each piece of art but rather that we take time to look, take time to appreciate the time and effort of the piece, take time to connect, and take the time to let the message and story enter our inner self.
